

1                                   **CONSTITUTION OF THE REPUBLICAN PARTY**  
2                                   **OF CROW WING COUNTY**

3  
4                                   **ARTICLE I - NAME**

5  
6       The name of this organization is the Republican Party of Crow Wing County of the State  
7       of Minnesota, and hereafter will be referred to in this document as: County, County  
8       Party or Organization. All references to County shall mean Crow Wing County, Party  
9       shall mean Republican Party, District shall mean 8<sup>th</sup> Congressional District and State shall  
10      mean Minnesota.

11  
12                                  **ARTICLE II – PURPOSE**

13  
14      The Purpose and objectives of the Party are the advancement of good government  
15      through the promotion of the principles and objectives of the Party as determined by  
16      the Republican Convention of Crow Wing County, the Republican Convention of the 8<sup>th</sup>  
17      District, and the Convention of the Republican Party of Minnesota. The objectives of the  
18      party shall be the maintenance of government by and for the people according to the  
19      Constitution and the laws of the United States, and the State of Minnesota.

21  
22                                  **ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP**

23  
24      The membership of this organization will be composed of all citizens of Crow Wing  
25      County who wish to be affiliated with the Republican Party and who support its  
26      purposes and objectives.

27  
28  
29                                  **ARTICLE IV – GENERAL PROVISIONS**

30  
31      **Section 1** – The County Party organization is affiliated with the Republican Party of  
32      Minnesota and its activities will be consistent with the objectives, platforms, and  
33      principles of the official state organization.

34  
35      **Section 2** – No member of the County organization is authorized to express the views or  
36      otherwise speak on behalf of any group within, on any matters of policy unless the  
37      group has first considered and taken action on such matter. This shall not be construed  
38      to prevent any official of the County organization from freely expressing their own  
39      personal views.

41 **Section 3** – Nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to deny or abridge the rights  
42 of any voter to participate in any Party Caucus, Primary, or Convention in which they are  
43 entitled to participate.  
44

45 **Section 4 – Section 4** – Anyone who has previously attended a Republican precinct  
46 caucus, and was eligible to vote at that caucus, may be elected to an office in this  
47 organization (**Crow Wing County Republicans**), if they are a county resident at the time  
48 of that election. **If they are not an elected delegate or alternate from caucus, they may**  
49 **attend the County Convention as a guest if they had attended and were eligible to vote**  
50 **in a Republican Caucus. A registered guest may declare their candidacy to the**  
51 **nominations committee for approval if they had attended a Republican precinct caucus.**  
52 **Guests must be nominated by a registered and seated delegate to the convention.**  
53

54 **Any Republicans attending County Convention, including those attending as registered**  
55 **guests, who reside in Crow Wing County, and wish to be nominated for all State, State**  
56 **Central or Congressional District delegate seats may self-nominate if they attended a**  
57 **Republican Caucus or if they did not attend caucus, must be nominated by a seated**  
58 **convention delegate**  
59

60 **Those unable to attend the County Convention but still wish to be nominated in any of**  
61 **the elected positions may send a nominations letter to the County Chair at least 3 days**  
62 **prior to the convention stating the reason why they cannot attend and why they wish to**  
63 **run for the position. Nominations must qualify as above and will be read during**  
64 **nominations at the convention.**  
65

66 **Section 5**– The position of any elected or appointed officer or committee member who  
67 is no longer a resident of this County shall be considered vacant and shall be filled as  
68 provided for in this Constitution or as specified by Roberts Rules of Order if no provision  
69 is made in the Constitution.  
70

71 **Section 6** – The executive Committee will designate the financial institution to be used  
72 as a depository for funds after the Republican convention in the odd numbered years.  
73

## 74 **ARTICLE V – FULL COMMITTEE**

75  
76 The full Committee is composed of the Executive Committee, the Chair and Deputy  
77 Chair of each Precinct of the County, and any District or State Republican Party Officers  
78 residing in the County. Hereinafter, this group will be identified as the Full Committee.  
79

## 80 **ARTICLE VI – EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

81

82 **Section 1** – The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Chair, the Deputy Chair,  
83 the immediate past County Chair, the Secretary, the Treasurer, six Vice Chairs, three  
84 representatives elected from each Commissioner District and one representative from  
85 each Commissioner District elected by the entire County Convention At Large. This  
86 organization will hereinafter be called the Executive Committee.

87  
88 **Section 2** – Any member of the Party who has been elected to public office or appointed  
89 to a position of authority can be nominated and elected by the Executive Committee  
90 and Commissioner District Representatives, as a non-voting member of the Executive  
91 Committee.

92  
93 **Section 3** – ~~A Minnesota State Legislator or their spouse~~ ~~The Spouse and the immediate~~  
94 ~~family (children, siblings, or parents) of a State Legislator~~ may not be a voting member  
95 of the Executive Committee. The immediate family (children, siblings, parents), of a  
96 Minnesota State legislator may not hold the position of Chair, Deputy Chair, Secretary,  
97 or Treasurer, or Vice Chair on the Executive Committee. ~~They, (immediate family), may~~  
98 ~~be nominated and elected to a commissioner district seat in the district in which they~~  
99 ~~reside, if they have attended caucus.~~

100  
101 **Section 4** – Any officer of the Committee, (Chair, Deputy Chair, Secretary, Treasurer)  
102 who accepts a paid staff position on a state or county campaign, must temporarily step  
103 down from the officer position until they are no longer active in the campaign.

104  
105 **Section 5** – The spouse of any Executive Committee Officer may not also be an Officer  
106 but may be elected to a commissioner district seat.

## 107 108 109 **ARTICLE VII – OFFICER DUTIES**

110  
111 **Section 1** – The management of the affairs of the Party is vested in coordination with  
112 the Full Committee, under the direction of the County Convention and this Constitution,  
113 and under the laws and regulations of the State Republican Party and the State of  
114 Minnesota.

115 Term Limits: The officers, (Chair, Deputy Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer), may not hold  
116 ~~the same~~ office for more than four (4) consecutive terms.

117  
118 **Section 2 – Chair**  
119 Duties of the Chair are to preside over the Full Committee, regular, special, Executive  
120 Committee meetings and the County convention, to set the date of special meetings  
121 and the County Convention, shall issue the call to all County Conventions, to notify  
122 members of the boards and committees of meetings ten days in advance of the meeting  
123 (regular and electronic mail are acceptable) and is an ex-officio member of all  
124 committees. Attendance at these other committee meetings is not required.

125

126 **Section 3 – Deputy Chair**

127 Duties of the Deputy Chair are to serve on the Full Committee, the Executive  
128 Committee, and to assume the office and duties of Chair in the Chair’s absence,  
129 assumes the Chair if it becomes vacant, and is an ex-officio member of all committees.  
130 Attendance at these other committee meetings is not required.

131

132 **Section 4 – Past Chair**

133 Duties of the immediate Past Chair are to serve on the Executive Committee and to  
134 assist the County Chair as needed. The immediate Past Chair is defined as the Chair  
135 elected prior to the current Chair. The immediate Past Chair is a voting officer position  
136 and may not hold any other seat on the executive committee.

137

138

139 **Section 5 – Secretary**

140 Duties of the Secretary are to record minutes of all Executive Committee, Full  
141 Committee meetings and the County Convention, and keep the current Constitution and  
142 the Rules of the organization. The Secretary shall also keep a file of all committee  
143 reports, minutes, official role of officers and committee members, and a list of all  
144 committees and their members as submitted by Vice Chairs. All official documents held  
145 by the Secretary are the property of the BPOU and are to be kept for four (4) years.  
146 These documents must be turned over to the newly elected secretary within 30 days  
147 after the election takes place. These documents are to include all meeting minutes, the  
148 official constitution, and any other official documents the secretary may be in  
149 possession of. The Secretary shall be an ex-officio member of all committees.  
150 Attendance at these other committees is not required.

151

152 **Section 6 – Treasurer**

153 Duties of the Treasurer are to be responsible for all party monies, maintain the financial  
154 records of the organization, disburse all monies as authorized by the Executive  
155 Committee, prepare any necessary reports to the State and as required by law, present  
156 financial reports at each meeting, be a member of the Finance Committee and provide  
157 financial records for audit prior to the County Convention. The Treasurer will assist the  
158 Finance Committee with the preparation of the annual budget and keep all historical  
159 financial records of the organization. Four years of all official documents as required by  
160 Campaign Finance, including software and all hard copies, are to be turned over to the  
161 newly elected Treasurer within 30 days after the election takes place. The Treasurer  
162 shall be an ex-officio member of all committees, except for the Audit Committee.  
163 Attendance at these other committees is not required.

164

165 **Section 7 – Vice Chairs**

166 The Vice Chairs will be elected at large at the County Convention and serve on the  
167 Executive Committee. Vice Chairs will coordinate and report on at least one committee.

168

169 **Section 8** – Commissioner District Representatives  
170 Attend Monthly Executive meetings and serve on committees.

171

172

173 **Section-9 – Precinct Officers**

174 Precinct Officers are elected to 2-year terms in even number years at the Precinct  
175 Caucuses. If a Precinct fails to elect officers, the vacancies may be filled by appointment  
176 and approval of the Executive Committee.

177

## 178 **ARTICLE VIII – COMMITTEES**

179

180 **Section 1 – Appointment**

181 All Committees will be appointed by the Executive Committee and must include one  
182 Executive Committee member.-Committee Chairs may obtain approval to add additional  
183 members by emailing a request to executive committee members.

184 Approval/disapproval is determined by a majority of responses received within 48 hours  
185 from date request was emailed.

186

187 A Committee needing approval for event entry or expenditures, but due to time  
188 constraints there is not 10 days to call a special meeting, the Chair and 3 Executive  
189 Committee members may then authorize a five (5) day email special meeting. The  
190 meeting notice will be emailed to all Executive Committee members five (5) days in  
191 advance. On the fifth day a quorum of at least twelve (12) emailed responses will be  
192 required to determine the yes or no vote for the event request. The result of the vote  
193 will be emailed to all Executive Committee members. All emailed responses will be  
194 forwarded to the Secretary for record keeping.

195

196 **Section 2 – Audit Committee**

197 An Audit Committee of three Executive Committee members will be appointed by the  
198 County Chair at the September meeting of each year, and at the discretion of the Chair  
199 & Executive Committee, may appoint additional committee members. Any members  
200 added to any committee by that committee shall be subject to approval by the  
201 Executive Committee. The duty of the Audit Committee is to audit financial records of  
202 the Party **for the calendar year, preceding the next annual convention**, and report their  
203 findings to the Executive Committee at the meeting before the annual convention.

204

205 **Section 3 – ~~Search Committee~~ Nominations Committee**

206 This Committee will be appointed by the County Executive Committee three months  
207 prior to the County Convention in the odd years. This committee will provide  
208 nominations for all elected BPOU County offices, provided however, that nominations  
209 may also be made from the floor.

210

211 **Section 4 – Credentials and Convention Committee**

212 This Committee is to be appointed by the Executive Committee to serve at the County  
213 Convention. If a member is not present at the Convention the County Chair may  
214 appoint a replacement.

215

216 **Section 5 – Finance Committee**

217 The finance Committee is composed of the Treasurer and the 6 Vice chairs. **If there are**  
218 **not at least 2 Vice Chairs with accounting, financial or budgeting experience on the**  
219 **Finance Committee, the Finance Committee may then choose to add up to 3 Executive**  
220 **Committee members with accounting, finance or budget experience to the Finance**  
221 **Committee. The additional members must be approved by the Executive Committee.**

222 This committee is charged to develop a budget and devise a strategy to raise adequate  
223 funds to support this budget. The budget and fundraising plan and any subsequent  
224 plans are to be approved by the Executive Committee. The Finance Committee may  
225 from time to time submit amendments to the budget for the current fiscal year, which  
226 shall be approved by the Executive Committee.

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231

**ARTICLE IX – VACANCIES & REMOVALS**

232

233 **Section 1** – Vacancies in precinct offices are filled by a meeting of Republicans residing  
234 within the precinct in which the vacancy occurs. If a precinct fails to fill the vacancies  
235 they will then be filled by appointment and approval of the Executive Committee.

236

237 **Section 2** – Vacancies occurring in the Commissioner Districts will be filled by a meeting  
238 of Republicans residing within the Commissioner District in which the vacancy occurs. If  
239 the District fails to fill the seat, then the seat will be filled by appointment and approval  
240 of the Executive Committee.

241

242 **Section 3** – Should a vacancy occur in one or more of the officer positions including vice  
243 chairs of the Executive Committee, the Search Committee will find candidates and,  
244 recommend and the Executive Committee will appoint a replacement to fill each  
245 vacancy.

246

247 **Section 4** – It is the duty of all Executive Committee members, **and/or anyone elected to**  
248 **a delegate/alternate voting position** to support **all** Republican endorsed candidates.  
249 Should any member of this body, **including elected precinct delegates and alternates,**  
250 **elected State delegates and alternates, and elected State Central delegates and**  
251 **alternates,** actively and publicly campaign against a Republican endorsed candidate, that  
252 member will be asked to discontinue the activity(ies) or take a leave of absence until  
253 after the Primary. **This includes taking a leave of absence from their delegate status and**  
254 **any activities or conventions they may have access to voting because of being a delegate**

255 or alternate. The next alternate in the lineup according to votes received will replace  
256 the absent delegate/alternate. Violations will result in possible removal as per Article IX  
257 Section 5. This constitution supersedes any other outside political organization  
258 obligation.

259

260 **Section 5** –A member of the Full Committee may be removed from office by a two-  
261 thirds, (2/3) vote at a special meeting of the Full Committee. The Member whose  
262 removal is under consideration must be furnished with a detailed written statement of  
263 the charges against such member at least ten (10) days prior to the in-person meeting-  
264 The member will be entitled to answer, in full, the charges against the member before  
265 the Full Committee, if so desired, before the question is voted upon, provided removal is  
266 the only purpose of the call.

267

268 **Section-6** – An appointed member of the Full committee or the Executive Committee  
269 may be removed by a majority vote of the executive committee. ~~that appointed them.~~

270

271 **Section 7** – Four absences, **over a two-year term**, from properly called regular monthly  
272 meetings of the Executive Committee, **if found to be unexcused**, is grounds for a notice  
273 of **possible** removal. **Absence from meetings requires written or electronic notice to**  
274 **either the Chair or Deputy Chair. Notice is to be given no less than 1 hour prior to the**  
275 **gavel in of meeting.** Should this occur, an official notice will be sent to the committee  
276 member by the BPOU secretary at least ten (10) days prior to the fifth meeting stating  
277 that the member will be removed from office upon failure to appear at any subsequent  
278 meeting. Upon the members’ absence at the fifth meeting, the position will be  
279 considered vacant and will be filled as per Article IX Section 2. Absences may be excused  
280 by a 2/3 vote of the executive committee.

281

282

## ARTICLE X – MEETINGS

283

284 **Section 1** – The Full Committee shall meet at least once a year (can meet more if  
285 needed).

286

287 **Section 2** – The Full Committee will meet at the call of the County Chairman, or at the  
288 request of 25% of the Committee. Notice will be made by electronic or regular mail at  
289 least 10 days prior to the meeting.

290

291 **Section 3** – The Full committee will meet to conduct Party Business.

292

293 **Section 4** – Twenty- Four (24) members will constitute a quorum of the Full Committee.

294

295 **Section 5** – The Executive Committee will meet monthly at the call of the County Chair,  
296 the regular date, time, and place will be determined by the Committee. Notice, with

297 agenda, will be by electronic or regular mail at least ten (10) days prior, to all members  
298 of the Executive Committee.

299  
300 **Section 6** –Twelve (12) members will constitute a quorum of the Executive committee.

301  
302 **Section 7** – Special meetings of the Executive Committee can be called by the County  
303 Chairman or by three members of the Executive Committee. Notice of special meetings  
304 of the Executive Committee, with purpose of call, will be by electronic or regular mail at  
305 least 10 days prior to the special meeting.

306

## 307 **ARTICLE XI – CAUCUS**

308

### 309 **Section 1-** Eligible Voters

310 Only those individuals who are or will be eligible to vote at the time of the next state  
311 general election, may vote or be elected a delegate, alternate, or officer, only in the  
312 precinct where the voter resides at the time of the caucus. **In the case of needed  
313 absence from Caucus,** signed letters of intent with name, address, **precinct,** phone  
314 number, and valid email, **indication they wish to be nominated for precinct delegate,  
315 written statement they agree to the principals of the Republican Party, and the reason  
316 for the absence, may be allowed but must be received and approved only by County  
317 Chair, Deputy Chair or caucus convener prior to gavel in. Caucus convener only may  
318 fill out and approve an emergency form, provided by Crow Wing County Republicans,  
319 for a called in emergency absence on the evening of Caucus. The emergency form will  
320 contain accepted reasons and must be completed prior to gavel in. Anyone found to  
321 have falsified information on an emergency form or letter of intent will be removed  
322 from any precinct status they received as the result of precinct elections including  
323 delegate or alternate election.**

324 Anyone attending caucus who is not eligible to participate must be registered as a guest.

325

### 326 **Section 2 – Agreement with party principles**

327 Only those persons who are in agreement with the principles of the party as stated in  
328 the Minnesota Republican party’s constitution and bylaws, and who either voted or  
329 affiliated with the party at the last state general election or intend to vote or affiliate  
330 with the party at the next state general election, may vote at the precinct caucus.

331

### 332 **Section 3 – Decision by caucus vote**

333 In case the right of a person to participate at the caucus is challenged, the question of  
334 the right to participate shall be decided by a vote of the precinct caucus attendees. A  
335 person so challenged may not vote on the question of the person’s right to participate.

336

## 337 **ARTICLE XII – CONVENTIONS**

338



339 **Section 1** –Annual County Conventions of the Party will be held each year during the  
340 period, and for the purpose designated by the Official Call issued by the County Chair or  
341 in lieu thereof, issued by the State Executive Committee, The State Central Committee,  
342 or the Congressional District Committee, notice by mail or electronic mail.

343

344 **Section 2**- The provisions of the State Republican Constitution are presumed to be  
345 incorporated as part of the rules of each Convention.

346

347 **Section 3** – County conventions, to include County Endorsing Conventions, will be held  
348 at a time and a place determined by the Executive Committee provided at least two (2)  
349 weeks written or electronic notice is sent to each delegate and alternate. First order of  
350 business is the temporary credentials report. The Convention will then proceed to the  
351 seating of delegates as outlined in Article XIII.

352

353 **Section 4** – Special County conventions will be held at the Call of the State Executive  
354 Committee, the State Central Committee, or the Eighth Congressional District  
355 Committee and anytime deemed necessary by a majority of the members of the County  
356 Executive Committee, provided at least two (2) weeks written or electronic notice is  
357 sent to each delegate and alternate.

358

361

## 362 **ARTICLE XIII CONVENTION DELEGATES**

363

364 **Section 1** – The first order of business will be the temporary credentials report. The  
365 Convention will then proceed to the seating of the delegates.

366

367 **Section 2** – A precinct will be entitled to one (1) vote for each delegate present and  
368 seated as herein provided.

369

370 **Section 3** – The County Convention will be composed of delegates and alternates  
371 elected by members of the Republican Party in the respective election precincts of Crow  
372 Wing County at Caucus, for a two-year term. Delegates and alternates must be of  
373 voting age by the next general election and must be a resident of the precinct. The  
374 number of delegates and the bases of their apportionment will be uniform throughout  
375 the county. The Credentials committee will seat duly accredited delegates of each  
376 precinct who are there and present their credentials prior to the time stated in the Call  
377 for the convening of the Convention.

378

379 **Section 4** – In the event no delegates are present from a precinct, the Credentials  
380 Committee will seat all accredited alternates from that precinct, ~~indicating which~~  
381 ~~delegates they replace.~~ In the event there are both delegates and alternates present,

382 the Credentials Committee will seat only the delegates and the vacancies will be filled as  
383 provided in Section 7. Should there be no delegates or alternates that precinct shall  
384 have no votes.

385

386 **Section 5-** The precincts will caucus after acceptance of the temporary report of the  
387 Credentials Committee. If the Chair of the precinct is not present, the seated delegates  
388 will first elect a Chair and then will fill the vacancies as provided herein. The precincts  
389 may also fill vacancies that occur later by informal caucus on the floor in like manner.

390

391 **Section 6 –** The seated delegates of each precinct will fill all vacancies by a vote of the  
392 seated delegates and will fill vacancies first from the accredited alternates. In case of a  
393 tie, the County Chair may flip a coin to fill that particular vacancy.

394

395 **Section 7 –** Alternates will be elected to fill vacancies one at a time to replace specific  
396 delegates and then the alternate elected to fill the vacancy will be eligible to vote in the  
397 next election to fill the next delegate vacancy.

398

399 **Section 8 –** ~~If such specific~~ a delegate arrives late, the delegate will assume their seat &  
400 replace the alternate who was elected for them. Alternates who arrive late will not  
401 replace anyone seated, except they will be eligible to fill vacancies from the precinct.

402

403 **Section 9 –** Delegates and alternates to the Convention, the Eighth Congressional  
404 District Convention and the Minnesota State Conventions will be elected in accordance  
405 with the laws of the State of Minnesota and with the Constitution of the Republican  
406 Party of Minnesota and will continue as such until their successors are elected, provided  
407 that they continue to be entitled to vote in the area in which they were chosen to  
408 represent.

409

410 **Section 10 –** If an elected delegate not present at the District or State Convention to  
411 which he was elected the vacancy will be filled by an alternate as determined by the  
412 number of votes received at the County Convention. Alternates will be seated in  
413 consecutive order starting with the alternate receiving the greatest number of votes, if  
414 it determined in advance of such a convention that one or more delegates will not be in  
415 attendance, then the County Chair or designee, will notify the alternates needed to fill  
416 the vacancies.

417

418 **In the event of an elected State delegate, no longer entitled to vote in the area they**  
419 **were chosen to represent, or an elected delegate who resigns in writing from State**  
420 **delegate status, the next alternate in consecutive order will be assigned the delegate**  
421 **position. If there are not enough elected alternates to fill permanently vacated delegate**  
422 **seats, then State delegates may be elected at the next County Convention to finish out**  
423 **the term of the vacated seats. If alternates result by the odd year State Delegate voting**  
424 **they will be ranked by order of votes received.**

424

425

426  
427 **ARTICLE XIV – CANDIDATE ENDORSEMENTS**  
428

429 **Section 1** – The County convention may endorse legislative candidates for public office,  
430 if such candidates receive sixty percent of the voting strength of the convention as  
431 established by the last report of the Credentials Committee, preceding such vote, and  
432 provided that such Convention, by a simple majority vote, has determined to endorse or  
433 consider endorsement at the Convention for office.  
434

435 **Section 2** – When more than one candidate is nominated for endorsement for an office,  
436 none of them will be voted on separately and the candidacy of all will be submitted on  
437 one ballot. If no candidate receives the required sixty percent (60%) of votes cast, then  
438 subsequent balloting will eliminate ~~all but the top two~~ the candidates ~~with the fewest~~  
439 ~~votes~~. Balloting will take place until 2 candidates remain, and one candidate receives  
440 60% of ballots cast or until a motion for no endorsement is made and approved.  
441

442 **Section 3** – The determination of endorsement for office, in which the constituency is  
443 not ~~coterminous~~ overlapping with the territory of the convention, will be made by those  
444 delegates residing within such constituency.  
445

446 **Section 4-** The rules of the Convention may provide that where only one candidate is  
447 nominated for endorsement for a particular office, endorsement may be granted if such  
448 candidate receives sixty percent (60%) of the votes cast on the proposal.  
449

450 **Section 5-** The Convention may provide an advisory endorsement of candidates for  
451 District, State or National office, provided that such convention, by a simple majority  
452 vote, has determined advisory endorsement is not binding on delegates to District and  
453 State Conventions.  
454

455 **Section 6** – The procedure for advisory endorsement will be limited to one ballot with all  
456 nominated candidates for the same office to be submitted on the same ballot. A sixty  
457 percent (60%) vote as outlined in section 4 will be necessary to be considered an  
458 advisory endorsement as provided for in this section.  
459

460 **ARTICLE XV – PARLIMENTARY AUTHORITY**  
461

462 **Section 1-** Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised, will govern meetings, in all cases to  
463 which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these rules and or  
464 any special rules of order the organization may adopt.  
465

466 **Section 2-** When there are amendments to the Constitution following the Convention  
467 the Secretary shall incorporate into the existing Constitution all amendments that were

468 passed and submit copies of the amended Constitution to the Executive Committee, ten  
469 (days) prior to a regular or special meeting to be reviewed for accuracy. When accuracy  
470 is determined, a motion for approval is in order. Upon approval the new Constitution  
471 shall become effective upon the adjournment of that meeting and published in printed  
472 form, on website, and electronically sent to Full Committee members.
